

FAQs

What should I wear?

- Closed toed shoes
- Appropriate clothing – no provocative slogans
- A hat – you will be mostly working outside

What should I bring?

- A great attitude is the most important
- Sunscreen
- Bug spray
- Gloves
- A chair to take a rest

What about tools?

- Tools are provided, but you can bring your own hammer
- A 9' ladder would be helpful on certain build days (wall, sheathing, trusses)

Should I bring food and drinks?

- Lunch will be provided, but if you have a special diet, bring your own
- Water is provided

What are the hours?

- Starting time is 8:50am – a safety talk will be given each day
- Finishing time will be by 3:00 pm
- If you need to leave early, let us know

Who will tell us what to do?

- Habitat for Humanity will provide the construction manager(s)
- The construction manager is the boss – follow their instructions since they have done this many times before
- If you do not feel comfortable performing a job, let others do it. Your safety is important

Do I need to sign up for the entire project?

- No, sign up for the day and task that you feel qualified for.
- You can sign up for multiple days

Will it be the same people each day?

- No, some days there will be 15 people, others it may be only 3. It all depends on the task.
- Names will be added for each day up to the number of volunteers needed for the task.
- Once the total number of volunteers for the task are reached, we will create an alternatives list in case a person can not make it

How do I sign up?

- A call for volunteers will be made in November 2018
