

# ***2022 ANNUAL REVIEW***



**Thanks to our dedicated volunteers and financial supporters, TEAM prospered in a year of unique opportunities and challenges. We continue to partner with the public and private sectors to help make our wonderful community an even better place to live, work and play.**

- America in Bloom awarded TEAM Punta Gorda its 2022 “Best City” accolade for the City of Punta Gorda at its national symposium in September. This award is bestowed only once to a municipality in its respective population category. A second award for outstanding “*community involvement*” was icing on the cake.
- TEAM helped to facilitate the COADFL response to Hurricane Ian. Partnering with the Charlotte Community Foundation, the United Way, and Gulf Coast Partnership, a volunteer reception center was operating within days to support countywide agencies providing essential hurricane disaster services. Hundreds of volunteers were placed where needed in record time.
- TEAM volunteers painted a Punta Gorda Housing Authority owned home which was then leased to a qualified low-income family. The following week, TEAM volunteers gave the City of Punta Gorda’s Bayfront Center a much-needed facelift.
- Pedal and Play in Paradise, Punta Gorda’s premier biking event, welcomed more than 400 riders in grand fashion after a two-year pandemic break. Exciting plans are underway for the March 2023 event. TEAM’s year-round free loaner bicycles are available at three strategic locations.
- TEAM assisted the PicklePlex board and volunteers in their development of a strategic plan. This capable board is moving quickly to implement the expansion of the PicklePlex project.
- The fully subscribed seventh season of the History Park Organic Community Garden is up and running thanks to the “all-hands-on-deck” debris removal efforts of dozens of volunteers following Hurricane Ian. TEAM and Happy Hour Marketplace volunteers participated in the reclamation of an old community garden near the Blanchard House Museum.
- TEAM facilitated the Charlotte Harbor “Clean Water” project by convening government officials and community leaders involved in the health of this critical asset. The objective is to identify current efforts to improve water quality and develop new projects that involve the community. TEAM has also been convening historic preservation groups and community leaders to discuss plans for the future of the historic Freeman House, the gateway to our city.





## America in Bloom Awards TEAM “Best City” Accolade for the City of Punta Gorda

America in Bloom awarded TEAM Punta Gorda its 2022 “Best City” accolade for the City of Punta Gorda at its national symposium in September. This award is bestowed only once to a municipality in its respective population category. A second award for outstanding “community involvement” was icing on the cake. This recognition is a tribute to the efforts of dozens of community partners and volunteers who toured and feted the AIB judges during their April visit and to the dedication of Punta Gorda in Bloom volunteers and co-chairs Alan Schulman and Richard Polk. The beautiful downtown was ablaze with new flowers by year end. No infrastructure was damaged during Hurricane Ian which expedited the recovery.

## Pedal and Play in Paradise Rides Again

“What a fun ride!” proclaimed a smiling cyclist at TEAM’s 2022 Pedal and Play in Paradise. Held on a perfect sunny March day, southwest



Florida’s premier cycling event featured four rides designed for all skill levels. Some 444 cyclists were treated to the amazing waterside beauty and history of Punta Gorda. Ninety-six percent of survey respondents said they would recommend the event. Food, drink and support services were provided by generous donors including Suncoast Beverages, Jersey Mike’s, Waste Management, Springhill Suites, and Harbor Scoops. Net proceeds helped fund TEAM’s bicycle-friendly related initiatives.

## Bike Loaner Program Continues to Roll

For more than a decade, TEAM's Free Loaner Bicycle program, in partnership with the City of Punta Gorda, has made brightly colored yellow bicycles available to some 6,000 riders annually. Host pick-up sites currently include the Sheraton Four Points and Springhill Suites hotels and the Laishley Downtown Bait and Tackle shop, conveniently located near Punta Gorda's Harborwalk. New bicycles go into service in 2023 thanks to the generosity of bicycle sponsors and proceeds from TEAM's Pedal and Play in Paradise. After Ian roared through the city, it took a small army of volunteers to remove all the debris and return the garden to its former glory. By the close of the year, the seventh fully subscribed season of planting was underway.
