Last week we harvested fennel greens, thyme, a handful of cukes and a bunch of potatoes! You'd think they were digging up gold! They were so excited! There wasn't enough harvested to share among the members, so we came up with a plan. I took the produce home and returned the following Monday with a tasty snack made with the produce.

So, this week the kids enjoyed home-made Fennel Cucumber Dressing with celery sticks. They were reluctant at first to try it but discovered they liked it. After tasting the dressing, they ranked the recipe and took it home to share with their families. They all gave it the highest rank. Next, they sampled the potatoes we harvested which were fried up in butter and seasoned with fresh thyme: They LOVED them!
